The candidates should be presented by institutions/Research Units, but a past, present or planned international mobility is mandatory. The application must be submitted in English, in due course, through “PDF” and “Word” format online, and **in only one complete document (including the letters from the two referents) and following the chronological order of APPLICATION below.** It must respect the template structure provided and the page limit (total of 3-pages maximum) and additional documents in Appendix (with 6-pages maximum) -CV, Motivation letters...-

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APPLICATION (2/3) (to be done in Calibri -11)

Research Plan: 1-page maximum

Experimental plan [aims, methodology (including design justification, power and statistical analysis), material and methods including statistics, if applicable: patient population definition and accessibility], experimental strategies; work packages and tasks (1-page max.)

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APPLICATION (3/3) (to be done in Calibri -11)

Budget and Host Laboratory: 1-page maximum

- *Project tasks plan with Budget (1/2-page max.)*
- *Short description of the host laboratory/group with 10 most relevant publications in the past 3 years (1/2-page max).*

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APPLICATION APPENDICES (to be done in Calibri -11)

5-6 pages maximum

- *Short bio of the future research supervisor of host research institution with main publications (1-page max.)*
- *Impact of the research (1-page max.): contribution to a better understanding of important hazards and risks; impact on society/communities.*
- **Applicant: detailed CV**, current affiliation of the applicant and including mandatory information: **PhD related information, previous institution, career breaks, international exposure, planned host institution, participation to colloquia, extended list of the most relevant publications.**
- **Names, Institutions (Research Unit) and email addresses of 2 referents:** referents will be contacted by you in advance to submit their reference letters (1-page max per letter). The applicant's post-doctoral advisor writes the first letter and the second letter has to be written by a different referent, preferably the applicant's previous advisor). These two reference letters will have to be attached to the application.
